## **BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

- To plan, teach and assess guitar lessons and any other lessons as reasonably directed by the Director of Music.
- To inspire and motivate pupils of all ages and musical abilities, and be accountable for their progress over time.
- To manage behaviour effectively, using a range of strategies consistently to motivate learners and involve them in developing behaviours for learning.
